ELDERLY MOBILITY SCALE

PURPOSE:

A standardized validated scale for assessment of mobility in more frail, low functioning, elderly patients. The scale assesses 7 aspects of functional performance, including locomotion, balance and position changes, all of which are intrinsic skills for ADLs.

EQUIPMENT:

None

INSTRUCTIONS:

Assess patient as he performs each activity and select the most appropriate score

SCORING:

Max score = 20

Higher scores indicate better performance

- **14-20** Maneuvers alone and safely. Independent in basic ADLs. These patients are generally safe to go home but may need some help.
- **10-13** Borderline in terms of safe mobility and independence in ADLs. These patients will require some help with mobility maneuvers.
- < 10 Dependent in mobility maneuvers and requiring help with basic ADLs (transfers, toileting, dressing etc.) May require Home Care Package/Long Term Care depending on patient's wishes and circumstances

Please note theses are general interpretations. They do not take into account cognition, safety awareness and other factors that may impact on mobility e.g. postural hypotension.
